



## PhD or MD Junior Faculty Position

### The New England Centenarian Study

The internationally renowned New England Centenarian Study ([www.bumc.bu.edu/centenarian](http://www.bumc.bu.edu/centenarian)) is recruiting for a PhD or MD Junior Faculty Position within the Section of Geriatrics and the Department of Medicine based at Boston Medical Center and the Boston University School of Medicine. Four years of funding from the NIH/NIA assures 75% time for the MD or 100% time for the PhD set aside for research. The remaining 25% time for the MD will be for inpatient and outpatient clinical geriatrics. For prospective PhDs, please note that this is a dry-lab environment (e.g. epidemiology) and if you are doing wet-lab research, you will need to come as a Principal Investigator with grant(s) supporting that work.

The ideal candidate will have a strong track record in and passion for epidemiological research or basic research relevant to the study of exceptional longevity and healthy aging. There will be mentoring and environmental support for academic growth and the expectation of development of a unique research niche and eventual independent funding.
