The internationally renowned New England Centenarian Study (www.bumc.bu.edu/centenarian) is recruiting for a junior medical faculty position based within the Section of Geriatrics and the Department of Medicine at Boston Medical Center and the Boston University School of Medicine. Five years of funding from the NIH/NIA assures 75% time protected for research. The remaining 25% time will be spent in clinical geriatrics. Thus, the ideal candidate will be board certified in Internal Medicine and Geriatric Medicine with a strong track record in and passion for epidemiological research or basic research relevant to the study of exceptional longevity and healthy aging. Mentoring and environmental support for academic growth will be provided with the expectation that the candidate will develop a unique research niche leading ultimately to independent funding.
